



CFFAR GRADUATE STUDENTSHIP IN ADOLESCENT FASD

CFFAR is pleased to announce its inaugural graduate studentship competition, dedicated to Adolescent-FASD.

CFFAR will fund one graduate student for 2 years (MSc) or 3 years (PhD) for graduate work in the field of adolescent FASD. This area is widely neglected and in great need of new data.

Candidates must be Canadian citizens or landed immigrants, and enrolled in a Graduate program in Canada.

The following documentation must be submitted **no later than April 1, 2010**:

- 1) An updated CV
- 2) A single page, single space description of the thesis project related to Adolescent FASD.
- 3) A letter from the proposed supervisor including the following details:
 - That the student is enrolled in a Graduate program.
 - That the student is supervised by the proposed faculty member.
 - Appraisal of the student's strengths.
 - Description of the research environment in the laboratory/research group.
